for the people who have nurtured your faith. And as we honor mothers, let us also remember the nurturing heart of our God, who calls us to grow together in grace.


May your home be filled with laughter, your hearts with peace, and your days with the presence of God.


#### 52 Week Fitness

Weekly group fitness classes remain on the GSUMC calendar. Classes on Tuesday and Thursday begin at 10:00 AM. Wednesday's class begins at 9:30 AM, and all classes are approximately 1 hour. The current classes offered on Tuesday and Thursday are Barre and Total Body Conditioning. Barre is a low-impact format inspired by elements of ballet, Pilates, and yoga. Total Body Conditioning is a high intensity format which combines cardio and strength training. Chair Wednesday class is for those who are new to exercising, or have been on a break from the gym, but are looking to increase strength, mobility, and balance. Most exercises for this class are done seated.

The first class is always free; subsequent classes are a recommended donation of \$2.00.

These kits will be sent to the Sager Brown Warehouse in Baldwin, Louisiana. From there, the kits could be shipped anywhere around the world or to a disaster site in the United States. The preparation of hygiene kits is a continuing mission project for us.

Rev. Julie Wilson, of Open Arms Community Center in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, has been our covenant missionary for the past two years. She is currently on sick leave.

So we have chosen Althea Belton as our new covenant missionary for Good Shepherd. Althea is a missionary of the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries, serving as the Community Outreach Coordinator at Gulfside Assembly in Waveland, Mississippi.

Originally from South Carolina, Althea came to Gulfside Assembly three years ago. She and her husband, a retired US Marine Corp veteran, are parents to two daughters, four grandchildren, and the legal guardians of two nephews.

Gulfside Assembly began as a retreat center for African Americans in the 1920's. In 2005, the campus opened a new complex of buildings. Then Hurricane Katrina destroyed all of the buildings—old and new. Today, Gulfside Assembly operates out of church building that once belonged to the Mississippi United Methodist Conference. They joined GSUMC in 1963 with their 3 small children. Mary was a Kindergarten teacher for 19 years and retired in 1994. She also taught Sunday School and VBS for many years. She sang in the choir and directed a children's choir for several years, too. Mary and Darrell were also avid Bronco fans. They went to every Super Bowl the Broncos played. They moved to Peaceful Valley so Darrell would have plenty of room for all of his hunting trophies. Mary enjoyed traveling with Darrell, then later with her family. She was also a geneology buff. GSUMC has been her church home for many years. She misses being here in person.



Jim and Leny DeRubis met in Mannheim, Germany, when Jim was stationed there with the US Army in 1960. After a whirlwind romance, they were married 3 months later in Leny's home town of Assen, Holland. Soon after, they were transferred to Boeblingen, Germany where their first son was born. 
